

Make your own rocking kookaburra

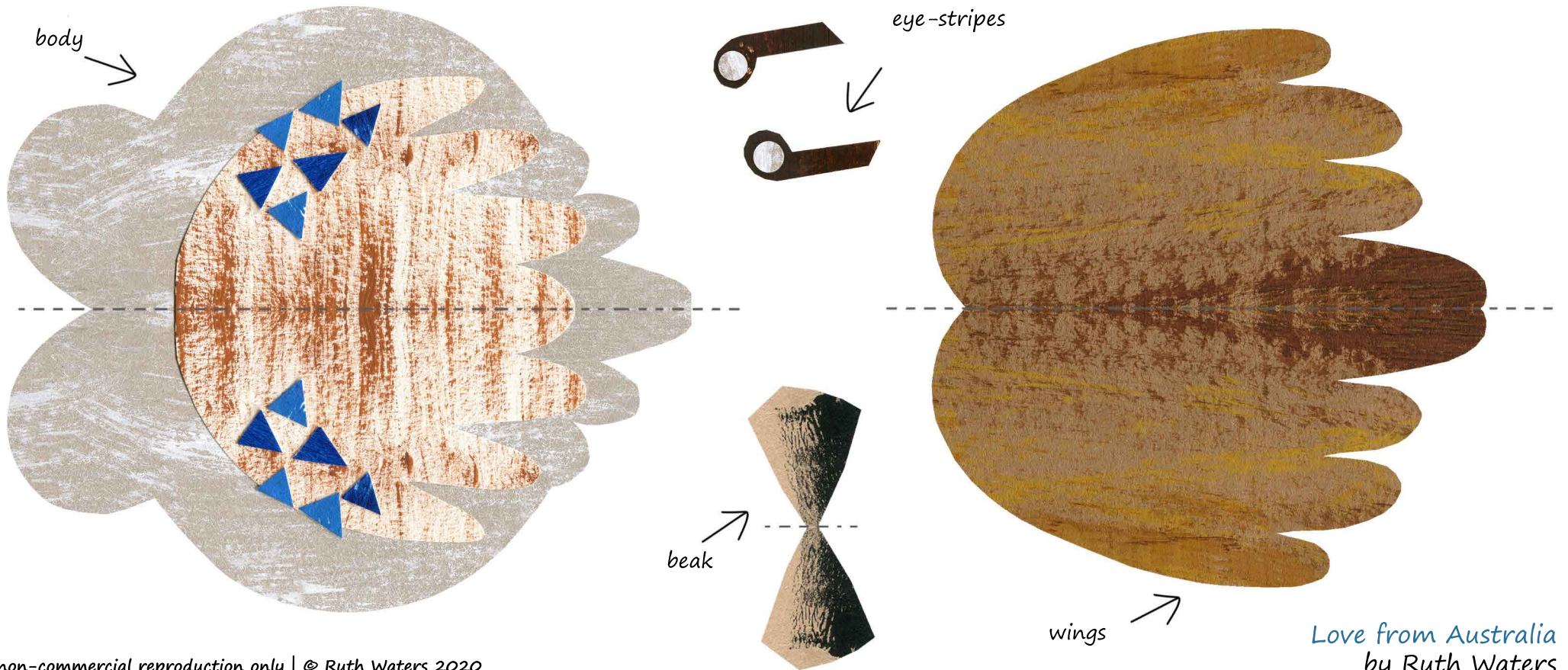
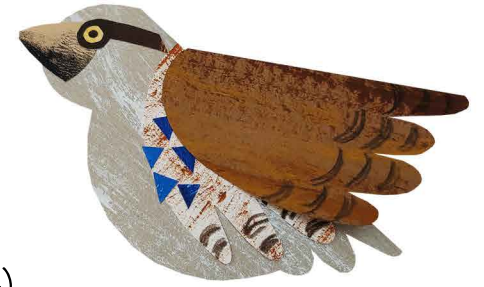
You will need:

scissors, glue, black pen and an adult to help with the tricky bits.

Print out the template on page 2 to make a kookaburra all of your own.

What to do:

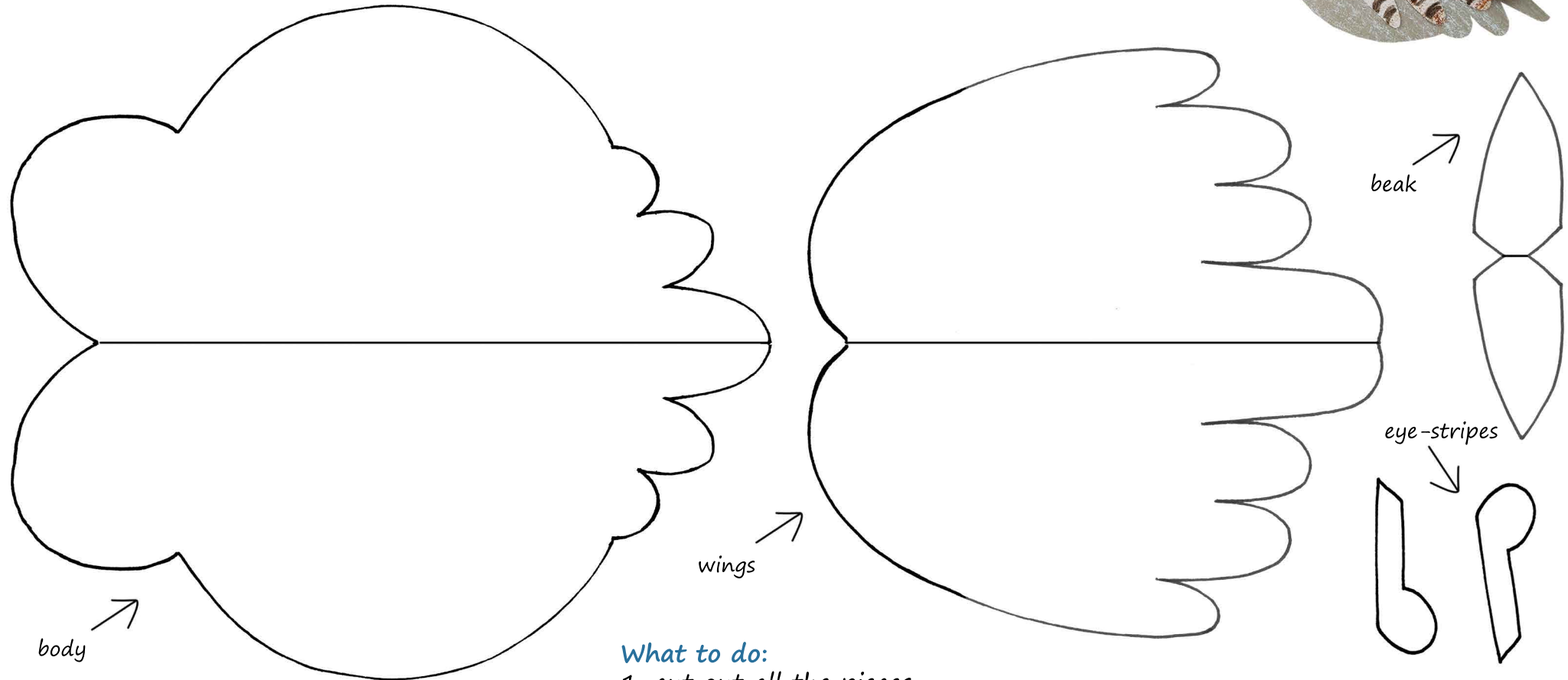
1. cut out all the pieces.
2. use a pencil to add details to the feathers.
3. fold the body and wings in half (along the dotted line).
4. stick the wings to the body at an approx 45 degree angle.
5. fold the beak in half and stick to the outer side of the head, on both sides.
6. glue the eye-stripes on both sides. Use a black pen to add the eyes.
7. gently pull out the bottom of the body, and get your kookaburra rocking!



Make your own rocking kookaburra - template

You will need:

scissors, pens, paint, glue
and an adult to help with the tricky bits.



What to do:

1. cut out all the pieces.
2. decorate your bird - try painting with old brushes, sponges and toothbrushes to create cool textures.
3. fold the body and wings in half (on the line).
4. stick the wings to the body at an approx 45 degree angle.
5. fold the beak in half and stick to the outer side of the head, on both sides.
6. glue the eye-stripes on both sides. Use a black pen to add the eyes.
7. gently pull out the bottom of the body, and get your kookaburra rocking!
